Mr. McGrath was president of
the McGrath-DeFoe company, publisher of the Charlotte Republican-Tribune, and president of the Eaton County Savings Bank at the time of his death. He had been Charlotte postmaster, city treasurer, president of the Charlotte Country Club, and food administrator for Eaton county during World War I.

Born August 15, 1863, in Ontario, Canada, the son of Morris and Margaret (Nix) McGrath, he came to Charlotte as a young man about 70 years ago and for a time was connected with the Charlotte Leader. He married Miss Ella Jackson, December 17, 1884, and Engl they celebrated their 66th wedding anniversary last year. Mrs. McGrath died last July 24. A son, Frank, died in 1919.
