Eaton Farmer Takes Own Life

CHARLOTTE, July 30 — Estley Sinclair, 76, a Roxand township farmer, shot and killed himself early Monday morning in a cornfield on his farm nine miles northwest of here.

Coroner Donald Burkhead, who went to the scene with Sheriff Everett Peck, said that a 12 gauge shotgun blast blew off the top of Sinclair's head.

Mrs. Sinclair said that her husband complained of not feeling well this morning. At 7:15 a. m. he said he was going to the corn field to work. He took a hoe with him, but also a shotgun that was on the back porch. Mrs. Sinclair heard the blast from inside the house and called her neighbor, Lyle Vedder, who went to the field and found the body.

Surviving Mr. Sinclair besides the widow are two sons, Lee Sinclair of Roxand township and Tracey Sinclair at home, and two daughters, Mrs. Mildred Keeney of Lansing and Mrs. Beulah Nesman of Charlotte.

The body was taken to the Mapes funeral home in Sunfield.

Estley Sinclair Dies At Home Monday

Funeral services were held Wednesday at the Mapes Funeral Home in Sunfield for Estley Sinclair, who died at his home Monday in Roxand Township of a self-inflicted bullet wound.

Sinclair had been a director of the Needmore school for several years and also held the post of Roxand road commissioner.
