Funeral services for Neil E. Joppie, first Vermontville Korean casualty, will be held Sunday September 13 at 2:00 P. M. at the Mapes funeral home in Sunfield. The body will arrive at Lake Odessa on Friday at 10:45 a. m.

Pvt. Joppie was born September 22, 1932 the son of Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Joppie. He graduated from the Vermontville high school in 1950 and entered the army in December 1952 where he was a member of the 25th infantry division. He took his basic training at Indiantown Gap, Pa. as a heavy weapons specialist. He landed at Sasebo, Japan June 8 and two days later left for Korea, where he was killed in action on July 4.

Surviving besides the parents is one brother, Leonard Jr. of Nashville, four sisters, Mrs. Warren (Leona) McNally of Albion; Mrs. Charles (Louise) Viele, Mrs. Larry (Barbara) Musser both of Vermontville and Joanne at home, and grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Will Ward of Vermontville.
