### Edward C. Harris, 59, Is Heart Attack Victim

Edward C. Harris, 59, Windsor township supervisor, Eaton county, died at the residence, Canal rd., R. 3, Lansing, Saturday morning, following a heart attack.

Ill for the past three weeks, Mr. Harris had suffered a heart attack at Angola, Ind., while en route to Florida. He was returned home about a week ago.

A member of the board of directors of the Eaton and Barry Fire Insurance company, and a director of the Billwood school board, he was also a member of the Windsor Grange.

Active in fraternal circles in Eaton county, Mr. Harris was a past patron of Dimondale Chapter No. 363, O. E. S., and a past master of Dimondale Lodge No. 449, F. and A. M.
