VERMONTVILLE, March 26 — Word has been received here of the death at Lakeland, Fla., Sunday of Dr. C. L. D. McLaughlin, 68, a Vermontville physician for 44 years.

Born in Chester township, Eaton county, he started practice here in 1906 after graduating from Charlotte high school and the Detroit College of Medicine. He was the son of Devillo and Esther McLaughlin.

Dr. McLaughlin had been active in civic affairs here, and had been president of the school board for 20 years. He was a life member of the Masonic lodge and had held high offices in that lodge and the Eastern Star. He was a member of the Congregational church, and served in the army during World War I.
