

Mrs. Tom Ogden Dies Sunday at Pennock Hospital

Funeral services for Mrs. Julia Maxine Ogden, 56, 703 E. Clinton, the wife of Tom Ogden, were to be held at 2 p.m. this Tuesday at the First Methodist Church.

The Rev. George Elliott was to officiate with burial in Riverside Cemetery.

Mrs. Ogden died at 2:45 a.m. Sunday at Pennock Hospital where she had been since June 11. She had been in ill health for a long time.

Mrs. Ogden and her husband were honored as "Alumni of the Year" in 1963 at the 76th annual Hastings High School Alumni banquet held at the Methodist Church for their great contribution, unselfish and untiring efforts in helping to organize the Barry County Association for Retarded Children. The program resulted in the erection of the Special Education School. She was the first president of the Barry County Association for Retarded Children and was secretary at the time of her death.

Mrs. Ogden was a life-long resident of Hastings and was born on May 10, 1908, the daughter of Hugo and Daisy (Surrell) Wunderlich. She was graduated from Hastings High School in 1926 and from Western Michigan University in 1930 with a bachelor of arts degree.

She earned her master's degree at the University of Michigan in 1936.

Mrs. Ogden taught school at Belding, Muskegon and Pentwater and married Thomas Ogden in 1940 when she retired from teaching. She was a Sunday School teacher at the First Methodist Church for several years.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by a son, James, and a daughter, Margaret, both at home; her mother, Mrs. Hugo Wunderlich, Hastings.
