Rev. Ira Calvert Snively, 88,
retired minister, passed away,
Thursday, May 14 at the Chel-
sea Methodist Home at Chelsea,
Michigan.

A native of Hudson, Illinois,
he was the eighth child of a

He entered the ministry at
the age of twenty and following
