Miss Teman was a member of the Grand Ledge Methodist church, the Charlotte Rebekah lodge, and the State County Clerks' association.

Her only survivor is a cousin, Mrs. Alicene Beekman of Greenville.

Services were held Monday afternoon at the Burkhead-Cheney chapel, followed by interment in Maple Hill cemetery.
