of Act No. 183 of the Public Acts of 1925, entitled as follows: "An act to provide for the training of girls in the girls' training school, continuing said school under the supervision of the social welfare commission; prescribing who may be admitted to said school; prescribing the duties of the officers immediately in charge of said school; prescribing the discipline and training to be enforced and provided therein, the compensation and other assistants appointed or hired in said institution; and providing for the enforcement of certain provisions of this act," as amended, being Laws of 1948.
