

Accidents Fatal to 2 in Area

An eight-year-old Holt boy and a 68-year-old Lansing woman died Wednesday of injuries suffered in traffic accidents Tuesday and Wednesday.

The dead were Jay Allen Lake of Holt and Mrs. Luella Morgan of Holt and Mrs. Luella Morgan of 716 E. Mt. Hope Road.

The Holt youth died Wednesday at a Lansing hospital. He was injured Tuesday night when thrown from a car operated by his brother, Kent, 16, 4794 Furney St., Holt. The Lake car collided with another at M-99 and Holt Highway near Dimondale, Eaton Sheriff's officers reported.

Mrs. Morgan became Lansing's ninth traffic fatality Wednesday afternoon when she was thrown from a car at Holmes Road and S. Logan Street.

TWO OTHERS HURT

Two other persons were hurt, one seriously, in the crash. Mrs. Morgan died about 5:20 p.m., about 45 minutes after the collision.

Coroner Dorwin E. Hoffmeyer said death was caused by head and internal injuries.

Police said Mrs. Morgan was riding in an eastbound car driven by Harold A. Fisher, 60, of the Mt. Hope address, when it was struck broadside by a southbound automobile operated by Syver Anderson, 73, of 4715 Krental St., Holt.

The impact threw Mrs. Morgan out of the car to the pavement. Both cars were extensively damaged, officers said.

Anderson was treated for a nose injury. Fisher, who suffered chest injuries, was reported in serious condition at the Ingham Medical Hospital.

The Holt youth is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Karold Lake, 4794 Furney St. They lived in Holt 1½ years, moving there from Millett.

Surviving in addition to his parents are four brothers, Karold, Kerry and Kent, all at home, and Kenneth, with the U. S. Army in Panama; two sisters, Mrs. Katherine Simmons of Marshall and Miss Margery, at home, and his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Haggert, Battle Creek.
