Tully B. Brown Dies Here Friday

Tully B. Brown, 90, of 320 Johnson St., died at one p.m., Friday at a local convalescent home where he had been a patient for one year. He was born October 4, 1873, in Clymer, N.Y., a son of Homer and Anna (Murray) Brown, and had been a resident of this area for 84 years. He had been superintendent of Maple Hill Cemetery here for 55 years. He was a member of the Lawrence Ave. Methodist church; a life member of Charlotte Lodge No. 120 F. & A.M., the R.A.M., the Consistory and the Charlotte Commandery, Knights Templar. His wife, Cora Kellogg, whom he married on May 28, 1897, died Sept. 17, 1954. Mr. Brown is survived by a son, Melvin, of St. Joseph, Mo., and two grandchildren.
