

Tebe Teman, ⁶⁰ County Clerk 35 Years, Dies

deputy clerk for eight years prior to that, died last Wednesday noon at Hayes-Green-Beach hospital where she was admitted Tuesday.

She had been in ill health for two years, but had been active in the office until entering the hospital.

She was born July 11, 1891 in California, a daughter of William and Louise (Stiver) Teman, but had been a resident of Charlotte for 47 years. She had taught school before becoming associated with the county clerk's office.

Miss Teman was a member of the Grand Ledge Methodist church, the Charlotte Rebekah lodge, and the State-County Clerks' association.

Her only survivor is a cousin, Mrs. Alicene Beekman of Greenville.

Services were held Monday afternoon at the Burkhead-Cheney chapel, followed by interment in Maple Hill cemetery.
