AN ACT to amend section 13 of Act No. 288 of the Public Acts of 1929, entitled An act to provide for terms for the trial of jury cases in justice courts in cities; to provide for the selection of jurors to try such cases; and to provide for the rights, powers and duties of justices of the peace in such cases," being section 730.263 of the Compiled Laws of 1948.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Section 13 of Act No. 288 of the Public Acts of 1929, being section 30.263 of the Compiled Laws of 1948, is hereby amended to read as follows:
