Ate 68 died Thursday at Lafay-tie. Ind. Born Jan. 30, 1897 at - Michigan. City. N.D., Dr. Rich served Lansing schools for 39 years and was superintend-ent for 17 years. He joined the Lansing school system in 1923 and served as teacher, athletic director before being appointed principal of Eastern High School when the school opened in 1928 serving until 1945. 'He was often called 'Mr. Education in Michigan'. Dr. Rich was found-er of the American Legion Boys' State Program, was instrument-al in founding thei Community College now one of the largest. Community Colleges in the state and directed Lansing Public Schools through their period of greatest expansion, 1945 or 1962. Lansing's Dwight H. Rich Junior High School was named in his honor at the time of his retirement. He obtained his Bachelor of Aris Derree at Kal-amazoo College in 1919. A veteran of World War I serv-ing with U.S. Air Forces. He studied law at the University of Chicago and coached for Illi-nois Military Academy. He. re-ceived his Masters Degree at Columbia University, 1926-27. A former president of Michigan Association of School Adminis-trators and of the Associated Public School Systems. He later received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Kalamazoo College. He received a Michigan State University Cen-tennial award in 1955. was active with Michigan State Troops during World War I.
