Mrs. J. M. Carter Of Vermontville Killed Thursday

VERMONTVILLE—Mrs. Jean Mary Carter, 46, of 177 Fourth St., Vermontville, was killed about 3:20 p.m. Thursday when her car collided with another vehicle on State Road just east of M-46.

Barry County sheriff's officers said Mrs. Carter's car collided head-on with a car driven by Wayne Lydy, 27, of 401 Harriet, Lansing. Lydy suffered severe cuts and bruises and a crushed elbow. He is at Pennock Hospital, Hastings.

Deputies said Mrs. Carter was passing a farm tractor and wagon when the collision occurred.

They said she was on her way to work at the Hastings Manufacturing Company.
