Mrs. Victoria J. Ball, 85, of
1143 E. Broadway Hwy., Eaton
township, seriously burned in a
fire last Tuesday afternoon at
her home, died at 11 p.m. Thurs-
day in St. Lawrence hospital,
Lansing.

Mrs. Ball, who lived alone,
was burned when her heating
stove overheated and her cloth-
ing caught fire.

Mrs. Ball was born December
20, 1881 in York township, Ful-
ton county, Ohio, daughter of
John and Estella (Boyer) Creitz.
She had been a resident of Eaton
county for 78 years. She was the
widow of Jessie F. Ball, a farmer
who died in 1940.
