Funeral services for Mrs Evelyn Stinchcomb, a former Sunfield merchant, were held Saturday, June 3, at Mapes-Fisher Funeral Home in Sunfield. Mrs Stinchcomb, age 99, passed away May 29 at Atoka, Oklahoma.

Mrs Stinchcomb was born on April 10, 1868 near Grand Ledge, the daughter of Thomas and Emma (Morris) Toaz. She had lived her entire life in the Sunfield area until 18 years ago when she moved to Oklahoma. For many years Mrs Stinchcomb operated a general merchandise store next to her husband's drug store. While in Sunfield she was active in the Democratic party, the Red Cross, Eastern Star, Rebekah Lodge, and numerous other organizations. Her husband, Theus Edgar, died 34 years ago. During World War I and World War II, she corresponded with servicemen from this area.
