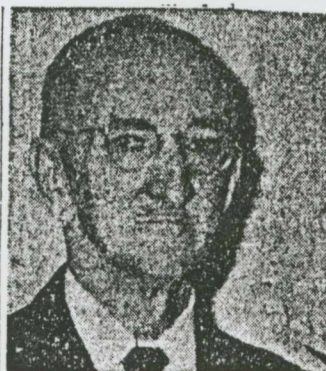

NASHVILLE — Fred Tarbell, 94, a retired shoe repairman, died early Sunday morning at the Thornapple Valley Medical Center where he had been a patient for the past 20 days. Mr. Tarbell was born in Eaton County. On June 9, 1894, he was married to Julia Callar in Ionia. They lived in Belding a year and a half before moving to Vermontville where Mr. Tarbell learned the shoe repair trade, which he followed for nearly 50 years. He worked in Charlotte and Hastings before opening his own shop in Nashville about 1920. Mr. Tarbell retired in 1946. He was a life member of the Charlotte IOOF lodge. Surviving besides the wife are a son, Clifford Tarbell of Lansing; three grandchildren; eight great-grandchildren and 10 great-great-grandchildren.
