SUNFIELD, Oct. 21 — Rev. Donald Carrick, 75, former superintendent of the United Brethren church in southwestern Michigan, died of a heart attack Friday night at Hastings' Pennock hospital.

Mr. Carrick, who served as church superintendent for 25 years before retiring two years ago, was a nephew of the late actor, Wallace Beery.

Mr. Carrick, who moved here 29 years ago, had been pastor of the Banner Street United Brethren church in Grand Rapids and had served at the church in Woodlawn before coming to Sunfield.

He was past president of the Sunfield school board and had been a member of the Sunfield United Brethren church.
