

Victim Dies After Crash

**Charles Bosworth, 28, of
Sunfield, Passes**

Sunfield—Charles Bosworth, 28, of Sunfield, died Sunday in Pennock hospital, Hastings, of injuries received in a highway accident last Tuesday.

Employed by the Mapes Furniture Co. in Sunfield, Mr. Bosworth was returning from a sales meeting in Grand Rapids when his car apparently went out of control and crashed off M66 about three and one-half miles northeast of Lake Odessa, according to police.

Passenger Injured.

Lawrence Porter, 33, also of Sunfield, who was riding with Mr. Bosworth, was reported in good condition Monday in Pennock hospital where he is being treated for rib and spine injuries.

Hospital attendants said Mr. Bosworth suffered multiple fractures and internal injuries. He was a former Sunfield mail carrier.

He is survived by his wife, Margaret; two sons and a daughter; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Leon Bosworth of Sunfield; five brothers, Allen of Toledo, Wayne of Vermontville, John, William and Lawrence of Sunfield.

Services will be held at 2 Wednesday in the Mapes funeral home.

State College**

TRAVERSE CITY, Oct. 8—Mrs. Helen E. Haynes, 63, state secretary of the Women's Christian Temperance union and former Michigan State college faculty member, died Tuesday at her home here.

Mrs. Haynes was born March 30, 1890, in Pittsburgh, Pa., and graduated from high school there. She attended Adrian college, graduating in 1912 with a bachelor of music degree. She was a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority at Adrian. Mrs. Haynes instructed at Michigan State college and was active in musical circles in Lansing. She was a leader in music activities in this community until ill health intervened.

She was married to Dr. H. B. Haynes in 1914 in Pittsburgh, the couple residing in Lansing for 30 years prior to coming to Traverse City in 1945.

She is survived by her husband, of this city; two daughters, Mrs. William Perdue of Jerome, Idaho, and Mrs. Robert H. Harris of this city; one brother, Wilbur F. Brittain of Steubenville, O., and seven grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon at the Martinson funeral home here, with Rev. William Malanowski officiating. Burial will be made in the family lot in Oakwood cemetery here.
