Charles Bosworth Sunfield

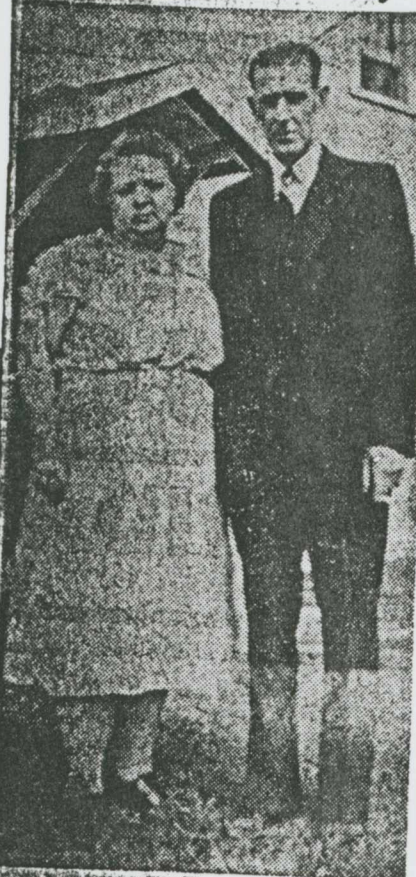
Sunfield—Charles Bosworth, 38, of Sunfield, died at a local hospital, received in last Tuesday. Employed by Sunfield Co. in Sunfield, he was receiving treatment in his car after an accident on Wednesday morning on Lake Odessa.

Passenger Lawrence Field, who was with Bosworth, was in condition at the hospital where he was treated for rib and arm injuries. Hospital authorities said Bosworth suffered internal injuries and internal bleeding. He is survived by his wife, Margaret, two sons, Allen and Lawrence, and a daughter, Bosworth. Funeral services will be held Wednesday in Sunfield.

Mr. Mrs. Cecil Wellman Killed on Railroad Crossing, Wednesday



Death struck again at Vermontville's dangerous railroad crossing, when two Vermontville residents were instantly killed and their son injured, at 207 Wednesday morning when their car was struck by a New York Central freight train. Killed in the accident were Cecil Wellman, 58, and his wife Bertha, 59. Their son Donald, 18, was taken to Hayes-Green-Beach hospital in Charlotte, where his condition Thursday morning was reported as critical. He has several fractures and possible internal injuries. Mr. Wellman and son, Donald, were on their way to work at the Charlotte Chair factory where both are employed. Mrs. Wellman planned to spend the day at the home of another son, John, near Charlotte. A 1951 Ford was completely demolished. According to M. D. Burk, coroner, the Wellman car

was traveling south and the train east at the time of the crash. It was not learned who was driving the car.

The train crew was composed of Frank Byers, engineer, Richard Flemming, conductor and Frank Porter, fireman.

The Wellmans are survived by two other sons, Clare of Vermontville and Keith of Georgia, a daughter, Mrs. Ruby Stofflet of Charlotte. Mrs. Wellman also leaves a brother Arthur Cook of Vermontville.

The bodies are at the Otto Funeral home here. Funeral services will be conducted Saturday at 2:00 p. m. from the Methodist church. Rev. Marjorie Hawkins of St. Johns officiating. Burial will be in Woodlawn cemetery.

Believe Youth Took Own Life

VERMONTVILLE, May 26—Dr. Daniel Clark, Barry county coroner, said Tuesday that Allen L. Eaton, 15, whose body was found hanging in a building on the farm of his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. George Bass of R. 1, Nashville, committed suicide.

No reason was ascertained for the act, which occurred late Monday, officers said.
