

Ray R. Sablain, the Belgian immigrant who boosted a small gravel business into one of the area's largest ready-mix concrete and gravel plants, died Monday at a local hospital after a long illness He was 71.

Dies at 71

Born in Belgium in 1883, Mr. Sablain came to this country in 1912 and worked first as a farmhand near Saginaw. He came to Lansing in 1914, and opened the Daisy meat market, which he sold to enter World War I in 1918.

On leaving the service he went into the gravel business with two trucks in 1919. The operation was steadily expanded, and in 1936 the ready-mix plant was added. The business was incorporated in 1945 with Mr. Sablain occupying the positions of president and general manager. I with widow, Dorothy; two sons, Ronald and Bruce Sablain, both of Lansing; two daughters, Mrs. Florence Gauss and Mrs. Dorys Hodgson, also both of Lansing; seven grandchildren, and one brother, Alfonse Sablain of Sebastopol, Cal.

Funeral services for Mr. Sablain, who lived at 2015 W. Lenawee st., will be held Wednesday at 10 a. m. at Holy Cross church, where he was a member. The place of interment had not yet been decided. Pallbearers will be Beryl Woodman, Jack Shaw, Lewis Ricks, Cecil Monroe, Robert Fuller and Floyd-Ackerson.

The Sablain office and plant will be closed all day Wednesday. Mr.: Sablain's body was at the Palmer-Bush funeral home.
