Dolph H. Wolf, 64, Dies in Tucson, Ariz.

**Wolf, One-Time Resident of
Charlotte, was Head of the
Tri-County Electric Co.**

Dolph H. Wolf, 64, died April 4 in Tucson, Ariz. He had gone to Arizona a month ago for his health.

Mr. Wolf was one of the pioneers in the co-op movement and had been the manager of the Tri-County electrical co-op in Portland since it was founded in 1936. At one time he was manager of the Charlotte office of the Michigan Bell Telephone Co. here.

He was a member of the Grand Ledge Lions club, First Congregational church and a 32nd degree Mason.

His widow, Cora, returned with the body, accompanied by her brother-in-law, Ivan Deland, of Arizona.

Besides the widow, two daughters, Mrs. Jerrie Krupp of Grand Ledge, and Mrs. John Overhouse of East Lansing, survive. A son, Dolph, Jr., was killed in an automobile accident in 1945, shortly after returning from service in the air force.

Funeral services were held Friday at 2:30 p. m. in Grand Ledge, Rev. Harold Watson of the Congregational church officiating. Burial in Oakwood cemetery.
