H. E. Powell Ionia, Passes

Funeral to Be Friday for Ex-Legislator

Ionia-(P)-Herbert E. Powell, 88, prominent one-time Republican state legislator, died Tuesday at his home here.

Powell was state representative from Ionia county from 1901-1904. He was a member of the state constitutional convention which framed the state 1909 Michigan constitution.

Powell represented Ionia and Montcalm counties as state senator from 1913-1916. From 1927 to 1932 he served as state commissioner of agriculture under Govs. Fred W. Green and Wilber M. Brucker.

A lifelong resident of Ionia county, Powell was a farmer and stock-raiser until his retirement. He is survived by his two sons, Ralph of Columbus, Ohio, and Stanley of Ionia, and a daughter, Mrs. Earle Harrison of Lansing.
