## L. W. Snell Dies; Wrote Boys Books

VERMONTVILLE, Feb. 1—Leroy Waite Snell, 74, author and former member of the Olivet college faculty, died Monday afternoon in a Lansing hospital after a long illness.

Mr. Snell, during his long journalistic career, authored 10 books, most of them boys' stories.

He was born in Vermontville, Sept. 24, 1880. He began his writing career in 1917 when he became an associate editor of the Michigan Farmer.

He left the magazine in 1919 to become an associate editor of the American Boy for the next 12 years. In 1931 he entered advertising in Detroit.

In 1936 he became a member of the Olivet college faculty where he remained for 14 years. In 1950 he joined the Oklahoma A. and M. college staff at Stillwater, Okla.

Ill health forced him to retire the following year.

He is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Raymond Spencer of Berkley, and Mrs. Arthur Hoyt, Topeka, Kan., and a son, Charles J. of Oak Park, and one sister, Miss Lorena Jane Snell of Vermontville.

Funeral services will be held Thursday at 2 p. m. in the Vermontville Congregational church, Rev. F. Willard Kime officiating. Burial will be in the Woodlawn cemetery.
