Sunfield Chief Dies on Vacation

Rites for C. E. Campbell
To Be Held Sunday

SUNFIELD, Feb. 14 — Charles Edward Campbell, 56, Sunfield fire chief, businessman and councilman, died Sunday afternoon at Bradenton, Fla., where he was vacationing with his wife, after a short illness.

Campbell, a resident of Sunfield for 40 years, had been chief of the Sunfield, Sebewa and Danby fire district since 1943, and had been a member of the Sunfield department since 1916.

He was also an insurance agent and the proprietor of a gasoline station and machine shop, a past-president of the village council, and vice president of the Alert Firemen's association.

Active in Masonic orders, he was a member of Sunfield F. and A. M. 455, Portland F. and A. M. 31, was local chairman for the Grand Rapids DeWitt Clinton consistory, and ambassador to the Grand Rapids Aladdin Temple.

Surviving are the widow, Ethel, and the father, John Campbell of Sunfield.

The body will be returned to Sunfield Thursday, and funeral services will be held at 2 p. m. Sunday at the Mapes funeral home. Sunfield F. and A. M. will have charge of Masonic services.
