

# Prominent Resident Frank Thoman Dies

## Member of Pioneer Family Served City On Council, Water, Light Board

Frank H. Thoman, 521 S. Grand ave., a member of one of Lansing's oldest pioneer families, died Sunday morning after many years of business and public service in his home town.

Born here Aug. 24, 1878, Mr. Thoman attended the Lansing public schools and Michigan State college. He served two terms as the sixth ward alderman, and was a member of the board of water and electric light from 1949 until 1953.

Until the time of his death, Mr. Thoman was active in the Ingham county welfare commission, Lansing Rotary club, Engineer's club, Masonic activities, and was a director of the American State bank and Central Trust company.

He is survived by the widow, Julia; two daughters, Mrs. Richard F. Reynolds of Lansing and Mrs. Elizabeth Reid of Van Nuys, Cal., and four grandchildren.

Funeral services have been scheduled for 11 a. m. Tuesday at Estes-Leadley funeral home. Burial will be in Mt. Hope cemetery.
