NASHVILLE, Oct. 19 — Joseph Heath, 89, former Kalamo township and rural school official, died

Tuesday, at his home, four miles southeast of here.

A retired farmer and thresher, Heath had served as Kalamo township road commissioner and as a member of the Mason rural school board near here.

He and his widow, Nellie, celebrated their 64th wedding anniversary March 23, 1955.
