Independent and the Bellevue 79: paper has since been owned by Donald Campbell. In 1929, Mr. 50 Lignian bought the Potterville 52 News of Ray S. Willett of Charlotte, and this paper was included 570 in his sale of the Optic to Mr. 589 Tucker last year.
