Robert Thompson, 25, of Vermontville, died early Saturday morning beneath the wreckage of a car, which struck a bridge and turned over on Kinsel highway, five miles northwest of Charlotte. The wreck and the body of the victim were not discovered until about 6 a. m., by Claude Smutts, a passing motorist. Thompson was returning home from work at the Oldsmobile plant in Lansing and is believed to have died from internal injuries and suffocation sometime between midnight and 1 a. m., according to Eaton County Coroner M. Donald Burkhead.
