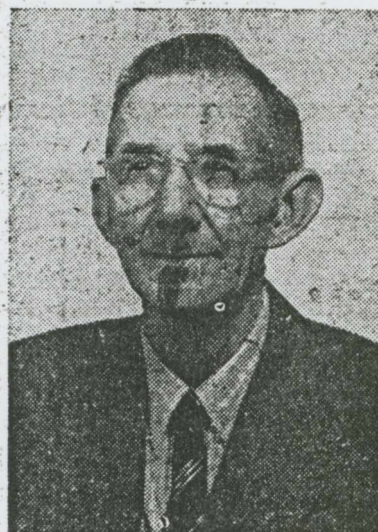


Services Held Monday For Elmon Loveland



Funeral services were held Monday at the Congregational church for Elmon J. Loveland 74.

Mr. Loveland, retired postmaster died at his home on W. Main St. late Friday afternoon June 3. He had been a life long resident of Chester township and Vermontville.

For the past 17 years Mr. Loveland served as village and township treasurer and was also mail messenger, and was a director of the Eaton County bank.

Mr. Loveland served as postmaster from 1921 to 1933. He was a member of the F. & A. M. 232 and an honorary member of the Lions club. He also served as caretaker at the cemetery.

Mr. Loveland was born December 15, 1880 in Chester township son of Edward and Elinora Loveland. He attended Ferris Institute and worked with an uncle in Muskegon and later in Vermontville with his brother Lewis Loveland.

In June 1906 he married Zella Ambrose of Vermontville who preceded him in death last July. Since her death he has resided alone.

Besides his brother, he is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Marshall (Vera) Berry and Mrs. Victor (Dorothy) Gutches, both of Battle Creek, six grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Burial was in Woodlawn cemetery, Rev. St. Clare Parsons of Greenville and Rev. F. Willard Kime officiating.
