# Lake Odessa Man Victim Of Injuries

LAKE ODESSA, Aug. 22—The funeral of Leonard J. Smith, 62, Lake Odessa upholsterer, will be Tuesday at 2 p. m. at the Pickens chapel; Lake Odessa, with burial in Maple Hill cemetery, Charlotte.
