## .C. Watzel Dies at 93

## Pioneer of City's Heavy Industry Broke His Hip In July

Julius C. Watzel, 93, of 1105 Orchard st., one of the few remaining pioneers of Lansing's heavy industry, died Monday night at a local hospital. Mr. Watzel had been hospitalized since he suffered a broken hip in July.

In the 1880s Mr. Watzel came to Lansing from Sandusky, O., and worked with W. K. Prudden, founder of Prudden Wheel company, as a wheel maker. He was a

In 1891 he married Elizabeth Emrich in Lansing. He left Lansing to take part in the Alaskan gold rush in 1898. He returned in 1909 and had lived here since then.


