Resident Dies at 90

Christian Guenther Was Charter Member of St. Paul Church

Christian Guenther, 90, the last surviving charter member of the St. Paul Evangelical and Reformed church and a member of the Lansing Liederkranz society for 73 years, died Saturday at a local hospital.

He was a tailor here for 40 years and later was proprietor of the Lansing Ice Cream company.

An active member of the Liederkranz singing group, he took part in many concerts across the country. He joined the group in 1883 and had served both as its president and secretary. In 1953, he was honored for 70 years of membership.

Long active in civic affairs here, he seldom missed a meeting of the city council.

Mr. Guenther came to Lansing from Wurttemburg, Germany, in \$\frac{1}{2}\$ 1883 and became active in the founding of St. Paul church. He became treasurer of the church and later was on the board of trustees taking an active role in \$\frac{1}{2}\$ the founding of the Sunday school.

He was a member of the Lansing Lodge No. 196, B. P. O. E. Elks. Mr. Guenther lived at 416 W. Genesee st.

Surviving are the widow, Louise; two sons, Carl F. and Christian A. Guenther; a daughter, Mrs. Edward G. Hacker, all of Lansing; a brother, Fred of St. Petersburg, Fla., eight grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren
