## Coolidge's Widow Dies

### Passes in East After Long Illness

Northampton, Mass. — (AP) — Mrs. Calvin Coolidge, 78, widow of the thirtieth president of the United States, died Monday.

Failing health—a heart condition, more recently complicated by a kidney ailment—had limited her activity in recent years.

In the booming "normalcy" years—1923 through 1928—Mrs. Coolidge brought to the White
