

K. K. Ward Dies at 61 Served as Deputy In Eaton 26 Years

Vermontville — Kenneth K. Ward, 61, a sheriff's deputy in Eaton county for 26 years, and former Vermontville mortician, died Thursday in Hayes-Green-Beach hospital, Charlotte.

Ward lived here and served as a parttime deputy until four years ago, when he sold his funeral business and became a fulltime deputy in Charlotte.

He moved to Vermontville in 1926, to establish the Ward funeral home. Before that he had worked for 10 years for New York Central railroad.

His wife, Florence, survives. A son was killed in an accident in 1937.

Services will be held at 2 Sunday in the Otto funeral home, Vermontville, with burial in Woodlawn cemetery.
