Readers Digest Aide Dies at 70

BRIARCLIFF MANOR, N. Y.

Dec. 5 (P)—Dr. Barclay Acheson, 70, founder and chairman of the international edition of Readers Digest magazine, died at his home yesterday after a cerebral hemorrhage.

A brother of Mrs. Dewitt Wallace, who with her husband founded Readers Digest, Dr. Acheson in 1939 founded a British edition of the magazine. It was the first time an American magazine established a foreign edition. Today the Digest prints 27 editions in 13 languages with a circulation of approximately nine million.
