Dr. Arie Binkhorst **Olivet's 'Grand Old** Man,' Buried Saturday

Dr. Arie Binkhorst, 92, "grand old man" of Olivet and Olivet college tradition, died last week Wednesday after a short, severe illness at a rest home in Lansing. Roy L. Fuller Here ICERS FOR

Funeral services were held Saturday at 2 p.m. in the Burkhead funeral home in Olivet, Rev. Charles Hastie officiating. Burial was in Kalamazoo Riverside cemetery. A memorial fund is planned to be set up in his name.

.Dr. Binkhorst came to this country as a Netherlands immigrant with his parents in 1882, and worked in his father's tailor shop in Kalamazoo. Eager for an education, he went to the city high school, adding work in a whiplash factory to his activities and became a naturalized citizen.

At Olivet college, where he graduated in 1893, becoming a member of the Phi Alpha Pi society, he earned his way tailoring. He graduated from Yale divinity school and took pastorates in St. Johns, Hart and Tucson, Ariz. After a post at the Chicago divinity school, Dr. Bink-horst was for 15 years field agent for Olivet college, with intermittent preaching which took him to every Congregational church in southern Michigan. In his recent years of complete retirement he was, well known in Lansing's Congregational churches.

Following membership in the Kalamazoo Congregational church he became an active member of the Olivet church and within the past year had occupied the pulpit for stated occasions. -Survivors are the daughters, Miss Donna Binkhorst, Lansing, and Mrs. Paul Wilson, Sault Ste. Marie; and two grandsons.
