Ex-Baseball Player Dies

'Dutch' Draher Familiar Figure at Athletic Events Here

William F. "Dutch" Draher, 79, long-time sports enthusiast, died Thursday at his home, 1513

Donora st. "Dutch" was a catcher on the Lansing team in the Southern Michigan league in 1910 and 1911. The team won the league championship in 1911. Shortly afterward he played with the Mr. Draher Boston Braves. In the 1920s he returned to Lansing to catch in the city league. Later he became an umpire.

He had been a resident of Lansing for 45 years and was a retired employe of Reo Motors, Inc.

Mr. Draher attended the South Baptist church.

Surviving are the widow, Anna; three sons, William, Robert F. and Thomas E., all of Lansing; two daughters, Mrs. Margaret Barnum of Lansing and Mrs. Irene Ribby of Holt and 19 grandchildren.

The body was removed to the Palmer-Bush funeral home. Arrangements have not yet been completed.
