

Mart Bailey Becomes County's 22nd Auto Accident Victim

Mart D. Bailey, 82, of 319 Pleasant Street in Charlotte, died Saturday evening, Dec. 21, 1957, in the St. Lawrence Hospital in Lansing where he had been taken as the result of being hit by an automobile earlier that evening.

Mr. Bailey was struck down at 6:15 p. m. at the corner of Oliver Street and Lawrence Avenue in Charlotte by a car driven by Mrs. Vera Anderson of Lansing. The driver was exonerated of any blame in the accident.

He was removed to Hayes-Green-Beach hospital for diagnosis and then transferred to the Lansing hospital for special treatment. He died shortly after his arrival in Lansing.

Mr. Bailey was born on January 12, 1875, in Vermontville, the son of Frank J. and Amanda (Bale) Bailey, and resided in this area most of his life.

Surviving are the widow, Maybelle Maye; four sons, Kenneth, ance and Keith, all of Charlotte, Charles of Battle Creek; three daughters, Mrs. Blanche Andrews of Hastings, Mrs. Glenna Fineout of Mason and Mrs. Mae Bursley of Charlotte; 9 grandchildren and 17 great-grandchildren.

Services were held Tuesday at 2 p. m. from the Pray Funeral Home, with Rev. William Foote officiating with interment in Woodlawn Cemetery, Vermontville.
