## Charlotte Man Killed

Mart D. Bailey, 82, Struck By Car Saturday; Dies In Lansing Hospital

CHARLOTTE, Dec. 23—City police are investigating the accident which resulted in the death of Mart D. Bailey, 82, Saturday night.

Bailey was struck by a car driven by Mrs. Vera Anderson of 613 Irvington ave., police said, as he was attempting to cross Lawrence ave. at Oliver st. about 6 p. m.

Charlotte police officers said Bailey walked in front of Mrs. Anderson's vehicle. The driven was released pending further in vestigation.

Earl McDonald, Lansing judg who was acting coroner, said death was due to a skull fracture.

Mr. Bailey was removed to the Hayes-Green-Beach hospital for temporary treatment and then taken to a Lansing hospital where he died about 8:30 p. n.

He had lived all his life in the Charlotte area, residing at 319 Pleasant st.

Surviving are his widow, Mabelle; four sons, Kenneth, Hance and Keith of Charlotte, and Charles of Battle Creek; three daughters, Mrs. Blanch Andrews of Hastings; Mrs. Glenna Fineout of Morrice, and Mrs. Mae Bursley of Charlotte; nine grandchildren and 17 great-grandchildren.
