Lawrence Robinson, 73, a widely-known retired businessman of Charlotte passed away Sunday noon, January 5, 1958 at the Hayes-Green-Beach hospital after a brief illness and surgery. Mr. Robinson was the Charlotte Buick dealer for many years before selling out to Har-

Mr. Robinson in his earlier years had been very active in civic and fraternal affairs. He was a charter member of the Charlotte Rotary Club and was one of the leaders in the state organization's work with crippled children. He was also a charter member of the Charlotte Chamber of Commerce and the Charlotte Country Club as well as belonging to several Masonic

He was born in Charlotte, the son of Samuel and Roselta (Whitcomb) Robinson on September 18, 1884 and was a resident of this area his entire life. He graduated from the Charlotte schools and later married Ora Carr, who preceded him in death having passed away on Nov. 10, 1947.

Mr. Robinson is survived by several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held at the Burkhead Chapel in Charlotte Tuesday afternoon at 2 p.m. with Rev. H. B. Loomis officiating. Burial was in Maple Hill cemetery.
