

Retired Pastor Succumbs at 66

SUNFIELD, Feb. 25—Rev. Myron H. Dawson, 66, a minister of the United Brethren church in Christ since 1914, died of a heart attack Monday.

Rev. Dawson, born Nov. 5, 1891, at Elmdale, had lived on a farm near Sunfield since his retirement last August.

His last pastorate was at Freeport.

He had served churches at Woodbury, Climax, Allegan, Lake Odessa, Lansing, Sunfield, Fowlerville, Kalamazoo, Hastings and Freeport.

For many years he was secretary of the United Brethren conference.

Surviving are the widow, Maida; a daughter, Mrs. Lorna Dunham of Lansing; one granddaughter; his father, H. H. Dawson of Lowell; two sisters and four brothers.

The funeral will be Friday at 2 p. m. at the United Brethren church, Lake Odessa, with Rev. Donald Carrick officiating. Burial will be in the Sunfield cemetery.
