Gary Frank Dies

In Auto Crash

Gary Lee Frank 18, son of Mr and Mrs. Claud Frank of Vermontville died Wednesday afternoon when he lost control of the car he was driving in loose gravel and hit two trees. The accident occurred at 3:10 pm. one half mile west of Vermontville on Vermontville highway. According to Coroner M. Donald Burkhead, Gary was dead upon arrival at Hayes Green-Beach hospital Charlotte from a fractured skull and broken neck.

Gary, a farm laborer on the Clarence Fineout farm 2 miles west and a mile north of Vermontville was on his way to

work when the accident occurred. A brother, Ronald was killed in an auto accident October 1, 1954 on M-66.

Gary was born February 8, 1940 in Vermontville the son of Claud E. and Mildred (Carey) Frank. Besides the parents he is survived by a brother Roger of Charlotte and a sister, Mrs. Joyce Kenniston of Hastings.

Funeral services will be held Saturday at 3:00 pm from the Vogt funeral home. Rev Louis E. Miller, Pastor of Reorganized Church of Latter Day Saints of Jesus Christ, of Lansing officiating. Burial will be in the Freemire cemetery in Sunfield township.
