

L. Donald Kelsey, D.O 59, physician and surgeon in Vermontville for the past 25 years, died at his home at 2:00 a.m. Tuesday morning following a long illness.

Dr. Kelsey served as Village President for nine years, was a member of the Vermontville Methodist church, Masonic Lodge 232 F. & A. M., Eastern Star chapter 342, Lions club, Chamber of Commerce, American Osteopathic Association and the American Legion.

He attended the University of Michigan, the American School of Osteopathy at Kirksville Mo., and graduated from the Kansas surgery. He interned at Highland Park Osteopathic hospital in the Detroit area, coming to Vermontville in May 1923. He was a member of the staff at Mc Laughlin hospital since it be-Staff. He served in the Student Army Training Corp. during world war I.

Some of the accomplishments made during his terms as Village President were: a lighted parking lot, road repair equipment, the water system. new boulevard type street lights and the black topped streets in the Village. He always took a very active part in civic affairs, serving several times as program chairman of the Maple syrup Festival Corporation, and he 11. was very interested in politics.

Dr. Kelsey born April 6, 1899 at Niles, Michigan was the son 04. of Milton and Ethel (Hatfield) 86.12 Kelsey. December 26, 1938 he was married to Hildred Figg of Vermontville.

Surviving besides the wife, 86, 10 Hildred are two daughters, Nancy, and Becky, one son, Douglas, one brother, Merwon of Mattoon, Illinois and a sister Mrs. Chalmer (Olive) Colcord of Niles. Michigan.

Funeral services were held Thursday from the Vermontville Methodist church. Rev. Howard Lindsay officiating and burial was in Woodlawn cemetery.
