Ex-Postmaster Of Colon Dies

COLON—Ellis A. Lake, 74, of 506 Maple st., former Colon postmaster and pharmacist, died at 3 a.m. Tuesday at his home after a long illness.

Mr. Lake was born Jan. 18, 1884 in Eaton County, the son of Jonathin E. and Ida M. (Dunton) Lake. He was graduated from Nashville High School in 1905 and the Marlett Pharmacy College in 1909.

He was married to Glenna A. Burton on June 15, 1911.

Worked in Constantine

Mr. Lake worked for the Armstrong pharmacy in Constantine from 1909 until 1912 when he came to Colon and took over a pharmacy of his own. From 1943 until 1958 he worked for the Gamble pharmacy here.

It is not known when Mr. Lake was appointed postmaster, but he held the position until 1932, and between 1932 and 1943 was employed at the Consumers Power Co.

Belonged to Church

Mr. Lake was a member of the Methodist Protestant church of Barryville, Baptist church in Colon, F&AM lodge No. 73, OES No. 91 and R. and A.M. No. 81.

Surviving are the wife; two sons, Karl B. of Cleveland, Ohio and John M. of Colon; a daughter, Mrs. Gerald (Frances) Kanaly of Colon; five grandchildren and a sister, Mrs. Ruth Hope of Arden, N.C.

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Friday from the Schipper Funeral Home with the Rev. A. Christopherson in charge. Burial will be in Lakeside Cemetery.

Mrs. Lina Knestrick Dies at Age of 89

Mrs. Lina Blanche Knestrick, 89, daughter of pioneer residents of Eaton Rapids died Saturday evening, Dec. 20, at a hospital in Okemos.

Mrs. Knestrick was born Jan. 30, 1869, at 1018 S. Main, the family homestead. She was the daughter of Oren and Mary Van Valkenburg Rose. In January 1889 she married Charles Ellison. They had a son, Harry, now living in Malta Bend, Mo., and a daughter, Mrs. Marian Church of Battle Creek. After Mr. Ellison's death she married James Knestrick. He passed away in 1943.

Also surviving is a sister, Mrs. Leora Conant. The two sisters lived together for many years in the family home until Mrs. Knestrick fell nearly two years ago and broke a hip. She had been in Okemos ever since.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday at 2 o'clock from the Skinner Funeral home, the Rev. F. Willard Kime officiating. Burial will be in Rose Hill cemetery.
