

AMERICAN LITERATURE

This course is based upon the study of representative authors and periods from Painter's American Literature. Essay work will be done in connection with the reading. The study of Lockwood's Lesson's in English will be continued in this course.

ENGLISH CLASSICS

This course is intended for the study of College Entrance Requirements. The object of the study is the culture and literary training of the pupil. Themes will be required on subjects chosen from each classic read.

ENGLISH LITERATURE

The study of representative authors and the periods of history as given in Painter's English Literature will be the work of this course. Essay work of a nature suited to the work read will be required.

GENERAL HISTORY

Text book: Meyer's General History. This course has for its object the understanding by the pupil of the great movements of history and their effects; likewise the arousing of his interest in great historical characters.

ENGLISH HISTORY

The study of Montgomery's English History will be supplemented by reference reading and note book work.

AMERICAN HISTORY

Montgomery's Students American History will be used as a text for this course. Library, map, and note book work; together with constant comparisons with English History, with the object of leading the pupil to think for himself, will form an important part of this course.
