The Hawkins family can trace their ancestors back to Sir John Hawkins of England where his son Robert was born in 1610. Sir John came to New England in 1635 in the ship "Elizabeth & Ann". They settled in Charleston, Mass., later moving to Conn. where with Roger Williams he assisted in the settlement of Fairfield, and his son Joseph was a prominent resident of Derby, Conn.

Zachariah, the great grandfather of Don, was born in Conn. in 1716. He served as captain in the Revolutionary war, displaying great courage and heroism participating with Ethan Allan in the conflicts on Lake Champlain. He was married 4 times, had 14 grandchildren, grandfather of 89, great grandfather of 95. He died June 2, 1806.

Moses, father of Jay, was born in Oxford, Conn. Aug. 9, 1761, came to Castleton Vt. as one of the pioneer settlers in 1779. He was a farmer and owner of a large tract of land. He married Salome Hulbert in 1784.
